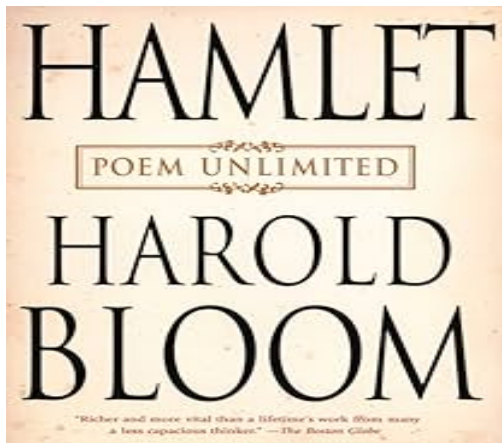


Hamlet: Poem Unlimited By Harold Bloom
