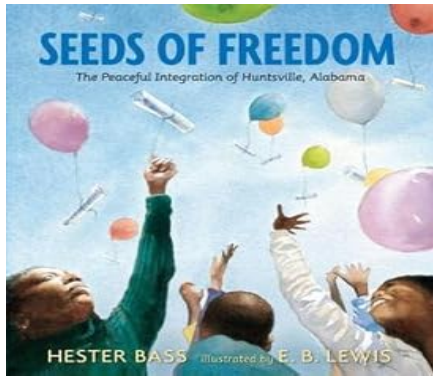

Easter time was a booming sales time for stores. This was known as Blue Jean Sunday. White ministers advocated for and supported Blue Jean Sunday. The people had a different message than that of hate. Thus the mayor advocated for freedom and peace. President Kennedy visited Huntsville to advocate for freedom. Four students went into the white school. I re read this book three times. There was no Bull Connor spewing vile bigotry. A powerful reminder. But they were committed to non-violence. They staged sit-ins at restaurants and public parks. But the greatest goal challenge lay ahead. The 60s were such a time of conflict and change. I love E.B. Lewis's watercolors. He expresses the pain and joy of those tumultuous times. More peaceful demonstrations followed. Slowly but peacefully integration began to happen in Huntsville.
