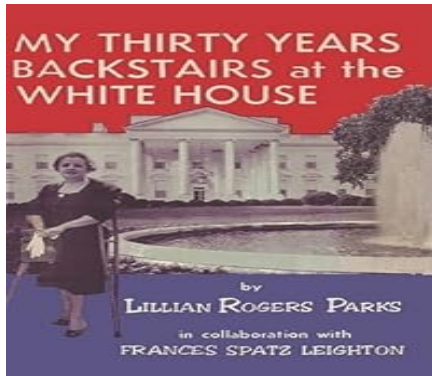

And who are the Hopkinses? The authors should have introduced each person (just a simple The president's grandson) when they first tell a story about them so I actually understand the significance of the story. **My Thirty Years Backstairs at the White houses 3d warehouse** Overall this book was kind of a letdown but that could be in large part because I loved Backstairs at the White House (book and miniseries) so much and this didn't live up to them. **My Thirty Years Backstairs at the White House booking** I did enjoy learning more about the Presidents and their families from the perspective of the downstairs staff for one and the author was clearly determined to maintain the time honored tradition of refusing to disclose any salacious details about the presidents or First Ladies. **My Thirty Years Backstairs at the White houser millard** (A refreshing change
