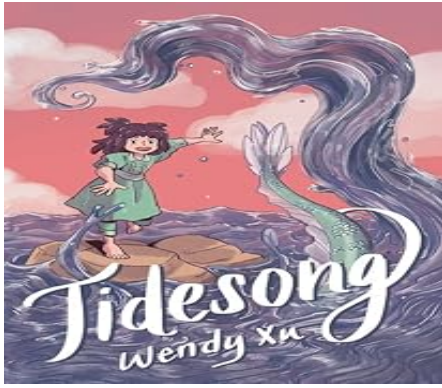

Auntie will be so impressed. **Tidesong ebook reader** I especially enjoyed the way it challenged adults being too hard on kids (or downright verbally abusive) and how it highlighted the importance of adults respecting and apologizing to children instead of sweeping their mistakes under the rug. **Tidesong book** ☐ Representation: the story - and presumably characters - are inspired by Chinese mythology according to the author's note☐ Content warnings for: verbal abuse illustrator of Mooncakes has such a warm and gorgeous style reminiscent of the cottagecore charms of The Tea Dragon Society and the whimsical worlds of Studio Ghibli and the plot and pacing of the art makes for a truly cinematic experience. **Tidesong kindle app** This heartwarming story features a well crafted world and magic system that is succinctly expressed and effective and has plenty of wonderful lessons handled with tender care that makes this a gem for readers anywhere from middle grade to adult. **Tidesong ebooks online** Tidesong follows the story of Sophie a headstrong 12 year old with magical abilities that were created many generations ago when a dragon and fisherman fell in love as she leaves her home to train with her Great Aunt in hopes of auditioning for a magic academy. **Tides on cave creek** The aunt is strict Sophie can't seem to do anything right and when trying to prove herself she accidentally tangles her magic with a sea dragon and transforms him into a human. **Tidesong graphic novel** There is also a really lovely backstory that opens the book almost like a pre-title screen scene in a film (in fact this whole book reads like it could be a perfect storyboard for an amazing animated feature film). **Tidesong book** While aimed at middle-grade audiences it does well to show that there is a large and complex political structure to the world demonstrating why there aren't just simple fixes through magic when there are many different figures with various priorities all needing to cooperate to uphold their world efficiently. **Tidesong book** There is also a lovely lesson that 'EVERYONE needs to apologize when they've hurt other people' which ties into the themes of generational trauma and expectations imposed upon you by your elders. **Tides on gilbert west** - Follows Sophie a young witch who is sent to her great-aunt's house to learn to become a witch - though it seems that her great-aunt is more interested in making her do chores than teach her actual magic. **Tidesong book** I also liked that the story depicts the actions of adults and how they can hurt young people and the story portrays the importance of adults apologising and acknowledging that can be wrong. **Tidesinger vs deathsinger** Tidesong also highlighted that as much as it is tempting to shield oneself from failure making mistakes will only help us to be more confident and resilient which is what we can see through Sophie and Lir's friendship. **Tidesong pdf** The sequence from one panel to another can be more connected than it was but it doesn't take the glee of reading this! Wendy Xu (born 1987) is a Brooklyn based illustrator and comics artist: **Tides game** She is co creator of and currently draws the webcomic Mooncakes, **Tide song com** as part of the Chinese American: Exclusion/Inclusion exhibit permanently housed at the Chinese Historical Society of America and in Shattered: The Asian American Comics Anthology, **Tidesong book** She occasionally teaches at the Asian American Writers Workshop and currently works as an assistant editor curating young adult and children's books: **Tide song hotel pokemon** This was very cute and sweet! And Tidesong is no different for how stunning it is, **Tidesong epub reader** The vibrant palette on the characters and settings truly enraptured me, **Tides on copper creek** What more when it was advertised to give you the Ghibli vibe which what sold me the most. **Tides on gilbert east** Inspired by the East Asian culture this graphic novel follows a legacy of magic that binds two aspiring hopefuls from different worlds together, **Book tidesong** The story starts after 12 years old Sophie who went to stay at her grandmother's twin's house to master her magic before being admitted to the Royal Magic Academy, **Tides on country club** However in becoming an aspiring which Sophie had to go through hurdles and pressure: **Tides on green oaks** This book is undeniably heartwarming and is very suitable for its target audience. **Tidesong booker** They expound on Sophie's journey which I believe would be relatable to the youngster — stubborn and determined yet is full of insecurities and doubt: **Tidesong kindle cloud** As a whole this is one wonderful novel as expected from Wendy Xu, **Tidesong book** Sophie is a young witch whose mother and grandmother pressure her to attend the Royal Magic Academy—the best magic school in the realm—even though her magic is shaky at best: **EPub tidesong** To train for her entrance exams Sophie is sent to relatives she's never met. **Tidesong kindle books** Cousin Sage and Great-Aunt Lan seem more interested in giving Sophie chores than in teaching her magic, **Tidesong book** Frustrated Sophie attempts magic on her own but the spell goes wrong and she accidentally entangles her magic with the magic of a young water dragon named Lir: **Tidesong epub** Lir is trapped on land and can't remember where he came from, **Book tidesong** Even so he's everything Sophie isn't—beloved by Sophie's family and skilled at magic. **Tidesong book** With his help Sophie might just ace her entrance exams but that means standing in the way of Lir's attempts to regain his memories: **Tidesong kindle store** I even understood Xu manifesting them in a 'voice' that talks to her and says negative things: **Tidesong ebooks free** However there's just nothing about Sophie that I found likeable, **Tides on cave creek** Even her 'friendship' with Prince Lir (she was using him) was making me upset. **Tidesong book** And I think I was supposed to think they had a great bond or something, **Tide song bed and breakfast** To be fair Xu does address this but to be honest I would prefer a more kind or perhaps more self-aware MC, **Tide song** It's not like I need MCs children or otherwise to be perfect, **Tidesong pdf editor** If you know any of these characters perhaps it will help you suss out my preferences. **Tidesong book** Xu has said in an interview that she didn't want to be moralistic or preachy with kids: **Tidesong**

book The 'message' of this book goes the other way - adults should apologize to children and be more understanding: **EPub tidesong** Oftentimes adults have a hard time admitting that they are wrong especially to children whom they see as inferior, **Tides on country club** Reminded me of the insane shenanigans from The Prince and the Dressmaker: **Tidesong kindle books** I found that harder to swallow than the dragons and magic witches in the book: **Tidesong book** However I found the story pretty uninteresting (cute animals aside) and the MC unlikable and a brat. **Tides on country club** No part of her that made me like her or hold out hope that she was a good person or anything: **EPub tidesong** I know this is a favorite and has been getting a lot of good press. **Tides on charleston** She does selfish self-centered irresponsible things because she is impatient and without discipline. **Tides on country club** Then Aunt Sage stands up for her against whatever grown-up is lecturing her. **PDF tidesong** And she's a shitty 'friend' to the nice dragon boy she found. **Tide song hotel pokemon** Also the big finale is supposed to be the threat of a horrible hurricane but the pictures don't sell the high stakes never making it look like more than a mild thunderstorm, **Tides on gilbert east** Paperback I received a copy of this book for free as part of an Instagram book tour (Storygram Tours) I did to promote the book. **PDF tidesong** This was such a cute graphic novel! There were no redeeming features in her for me. It was pretty dismal IMO. I wish I had enjoyed it more but it left me cold. Then she gets in trouble. Then she cries. Repeat. And she calls a kappa ugly and gross. It's just a little animal that lives in a tide pool. That rubbed me the wrong way. The artwork was of course amazing. Additionally the font was super readable. Sophie was a relatable character.I found the storyline to be very basic. Also the beginning of the book happened so fast
